As you will have a Free Day on Saturday, 11th.October, I am attaching a List of Places you might like to visit.

Near the Hotel you have the Walker Art Gallery, Central Library and World Museum. Not forgetting St.George's Hall, a magnificent building. A Guided Tour can be arranged if you let me have your Names before the Reunion.

On the Waterfront, you have the Merseyside Maritime Museum, Museum of Liverpool and the Tate Liverpool Art Gallery. It is hoped to be able to have a look at Liverpool Old Dock. This was the world's first Wet Dock, completed in 1715. The best website for this is familyadventureproject.org/2011/12/liverpool If you are interested please let me know so I can book beforehand. The Restaurant on the 4th.Floor of the Maritime Museum is good and you have a good view of the area.

You might like a trip on a Mersey Ferry, with a commentary. The ferry leaves in front of the Cunard Building, the Middle Grace. The other two are the Liver Building and the Port of Liverpool Building. It is possible to view the inside of the Cunard and the Liverpool Building by asking the Caretakers. The easiest way to go to the Waterfront is by Underground from Lime Street to James Street Station.

The two Cathedrals are well worth a visit, both have Guides and Cafes. You should allow an hour in each Cathedral. If you wish to view, please let me have your names before the event.

If there are any Old Boys from the CONWAY, the "Friends of the CONWAY" can pick you up and take you across the River to the Mother Chapel in Birkenhead. A fascinating place with lots of momemtos of the Old Days. Again please let me have your names beforehand so I can make arrangements.

If anyone fancies visiting a Steam, Twin Screw Tug, 110 years old, undergoing a long renovation, please let me know, I will arrange transport to the "DANIEL ADAMSON". The website www.danieladamson.co.uk
